3-digit numbers; NO Letters (001, 002 etc.= Gallatin section 051, 053 etc. = NOT Gallatin section 501, 504 etc.= Evening section 801, 802 etc. = Lab section)	Traditional, In-Person, Face-to-Face	Instructor lectures in a traditional classroom setting
A (i.e. A01, A02, etc.)	Honors	For students admitted to the honors program only
B (i.e. B01, B02, etc.)	Cohort	Intended for cohort students. Some sections are available for non-cohort students as well.
C (i.e. C01, C02, etc.)	*Online VSCC eLearn	Additional fees may not covered by TN Promise: course is accessed through https://elearn.volstate.edu (use browser such as Google Chrome, or Mozilla Firefox, Internet Explorer not supported.) Books are purchased at the Vol State bookstore, course is taught by a Vol State instructor; proctored (in-person) exams may be required.
CX (i.e. CX1, CX2, etc.)	*Online VSCC eLearn Learning Support	see *Online VSCC eLearn description) Designates Learning Support courses for students with low placement scores; Learning Support sections usually paired with a particular college level course of same section number. (i.e. ENGL 1010 CX1 + ENGL 0810 CX1)
D (i.e. D01, D02, etc.)	ITV	Taught on main campus and simulcast to another campus
E (i.e. E01, E02, etc.)	ESOL	English for speakers of other languages
H (i.e. H01, H31, etc.)	*Hybrid	25% in person, 75% online (or sometimes 50%/50%)
I	Study Abroad	International travel included
MC (i.e. MC1, MC2, etc.)	Middle College High School	Sections designated for Middle College high school students but also open to all students.

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MM (i.e. MM1, MM2, etc.)	Maymester	Classes meet only during the 3-week May term (5-days per week, 3-hours per day)
Q (i.e. Q01, Q52, etc.)	Non-traditional, In-Person, Computer Lab	Meets in a computer lab often with other courses in the same room (like a "one-room schoolhouse" approach) with content delivery similar to an online course. The instructor assists individual students as needed but does not lecture.
R (i.e. R01, R50, R88, etc.)	*Online TN eCampus (formerly RODP)	Additional fees not covered by TN Promise; course is accessed through https://gotoclass.tncampus.org (use browser such as Google Chrome, or Mozilla Firefox, Internet Explorer not supported); books are purchased through TN eCampus website; course is taught by instructor from any public college in TN; proctored (in-person exams may be required.)
T	Fast Track	Sections designated for students in fast-track completion programs
U	Dual Enrollment	Dual Enrollment; High School Classes
W (i.e. W51, W52, etc.)	Weekend	Course taught only on the weekends
X (i.e. X01, X02, etc.)	Learning Support	Designates Learning Support courses for students with low placement scores; Learning Support sections usually paired with a particular college level course of same section number. (i.e. ENGL 1010 X03 + ENGL 0810 X03)
Y (i.e. Y01, Y02, etc.)	Virtual Classes	Classes will use a videoconferencing service (for example, Zoom) to meet at an assigned time to deliver live instruction. These are labeled Virtual Class: Synchronous, which just means that they have assigned days and times for the online class meetings.

*** For online and hybrid courses, students are responsible for logging into the course on the first day of the semester. The instructors will not contact the students prior to the first day of class.**
