Harold Pulliam, Rhea's father, has also taken classes at Vol State throughout the '80s. Mr. Pulliam took classes to advance his career while working for Ford Glass, but he also gained personal enjoyment from the classes. He has accumulated almost 40 semester hours of credit from Vol State.

Rhea's older son, Jesse Keen, took Dual Enrollment English classes before coming to Vol State full-time. He has since moved on to MTSU to complete his degree. Vol State Embarks on Education Globalization

Warren Nichols, President, John Espey, Dean of Business and Terry Bubb, Director of Advising recently visited Argentina to establish relationships with colleges there as part of our International focus. The purpose of the trip is for Volunteer State Community College to develop partnerships with Argentinean Colleges. "It is our intent that the visit will lead to student travel study abroad, internships, faculty, and staff exchanges" Terry Bubb explained. The trip is the direct result of VSCC now being a member of CCID, Community Colleges For International Development, Inc. In order to fund the International program, the SGA and student body elected to add an international fee to their current tuition.

Terry Bubb stated, "During the trip, we had the opportunity to visit the Universidad Catolica de Salta (Catholic University of Salta). We were very impressed with this University and can see many potential opportunities for exchanges. The team also participated in meetings and conferences at the following places: The Ministry of Education, The National Technological Education Institute, and the National Academy of Education. Mr. Bubb also added, "We made many good contacts and learned a great deal about the Argentine educational system. We continue to be optimistic about the possibility of setting up some wonderful exchanges with some Argentine educational institutions. We will follow up regularly with all of the contacts we made in Argentina".

Stay tuned for more information on what plan of action Vol State will be taking in the near future concerning our new-formed relationships with the Argentine educational community.

Vol State College houses Service Learning Initiative by Dr. Rick Parren

VSCC is part of a national and state wide initiative called <u>The Campus Compact and The Tennessee Campus Compact</u>. The compact is made up of voluntary membership of higher education institutions from the Tennessee Board of Regents, the University of Tennessee System and the Tennessee Independent Colleges and Universities Association. The goal of this organization is to enrich the educational experiences of students in higher education through active civic engagement and service learning while partnering with community agencies, organizations and business/educational entities to provide volunteer service. This initiative through the leadership of Dr. Rick Parrent, Director of the Office of Career Placement, Cooperative Education and Service Learning. CSSEE research and other assessments report a relationship between student engagement via service/civic involvement and persistence/retention and educational attainment. AACC (American Association of Community Colleges 1995 to 2003) research suggests that there are more pervasive and stronger service learning programs in community colleges in 2003 than 1995 with increased course offerings, increases in student participation and faculty involvement.

Service Learning positively impacts the development of creative and effective problem-solving skills. These opportunities may place the student into multicultural environments that expand student compassion, civic awareness, and a desire to be civically engaged. Additionally, Service Learning uses direct experience and hands on learning to help the student learn to take initiative, assume responsibility and become self-sufficient as well as improve deliberative, collaborative, and leadership skills. Such experience provide a higher level of awareness that proves useful in future career(s), in family life, and in involvement in the community.
