WHAT IS PCMC?

The Putnam County Middle College is a collaboration between Putnam County Schools and Volunteer State Community College. The middle college is designed so that the middle college student can earn enough college credits to graduate with both a high school diploma and a VSCC associate degree.

MISSION STATEMENT:

The mission for the Putnam County Middle College is to **ENGAGE** students in a supportive and innovative learning environment, **INSPIRE** students as they blend high school and college experiences, and give our students the opportunity to **ACHIEVE** future success in higher education and beyond.

WHY CONSIDER PCMC?

- Complete most or all of an associate degree by high school graduation.
- Little to no cost to the students or their parents.
- Challenging full-time college courses each semester.
- Head-start on your college degree.
- Start your career sooner.
- More autonomy in the learning environment and flexible study schedules.
- Continued connection to your high school through extracurricular activities and graduation.

ELIGIBILITY & INSTRUCTIONS:

To be eligible for this grant, each student must:

- Be a rising junior in Cookeville High School, Monterey High School, Upperman High School, VITAL School, or White Plains Academy.
- Have appropriate college level placement scores (more detail on the webpage).
- Have completed the middle college application and Vol State applications (free).

KEY DETAILS:


- Complete most or all of an associate degree.
- Middle college students will take courses at the Vol State Cookeville Campus from morning (earliest courses start at 8:00 a.m.) to early afternoon with students returning to their high schools in the afternoon (2:10 p.m.) for extracurricular programming.
- Middle college students must study full-time each semester.
- Students will remain connected and graduate with their high schools.
- The Putnam County Middle College has its own exclusive space at the Vol State Cookeville campus dedicated to the middle college students.
- Funding is available to offset tuition costs.
